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Note from the President

If it weren't for Friends...

You would be the smartest person around. You'd always be close to perfect and no one would ever see the real you. But as we all know, life doesn't work like that and even though we all think we're good at most things, it takes time with friends to point out to yourself that you're not even close to perfect..

As you know, Kim and I are restoring a Cobra II. In May of this year we had a new 302 crate engine delivered to the house and have been gathering the many items we needed for the engine before we can install it in the car. Three weeks ago, Larry came over to the house and we installed the intake on the engine. This seems like a simple thing with a small block as you don't have to pull the pushrods like you do on an FE big block.

It seems like I didn't have the right gasket sealer so off we go to the parts store to get the right type. Back home, we pull the bag off the engine and put the gasket sealer on the top ends of the block. We go to put on the intake and the valve covers stick out to far and we have to take them off. Well, I used an extension on the socket wrench I was using and it somehow got set in the upper engine valley, which we didn't find out until after we had placed the intake on and torqued down and was putting the valve covers back on and Larry asked for the extension. So off comes the intake, extension removed and on it goes again. Earlier, we ran to run back to the parts store because Larry's torque wrench didn't fit my sockets. But at least the intake was on.

My friend, Mike, has an engine lift and said I could use it as long as I wanted. Neither one of us has a pickup, so I told him I'd call another friend Jeff, who has a pickup. So I set a day for Jeff to come to supper and then we'll go get the engine lift. I let Mike know and he informs me that to get the engine lift we have to go to his Dad's house and pick up a lawn mower first. No problem, friends helping friends, right! So the day before we're set to do all this I get called to work at Menard for a week. These days start by getting up at 3:30 AM and hoping to get back home between 4 or 5 PM at the latest. Well, the night to do all this, I don't get home till 6:15. Kim and Jeff are already eating by the time I get home. I grab a quick bit and off we go. By the time we get back and off load and find a place to store the engine lift, it's 8:45 and I'm ready to shower and hit the bed.

It takes me two weeks to get the front of the engine dressed (water pump, power steering pump, oil filter and sending unit, alternator and pulleys). I've had access to 5 parts cars (3 bought) and had numerous pulleys for the camshaft and water pump and trying to figure out which ones were right was a real chore as all are different as to 4, 6, or 8 cylinder, air conditioning and air pump! I finally figure it out, go to Paul's and sand blast, bring them home and paint them, put them on the engine and it won't work (didn't line up). An old non sand blasted one would work, but then I find out I have no fan spacer bolts (have them somewhere, I'll find them a years after the car's on the road). A day in the junkyard looking for the right bolts.

Two days before leaving for Kansas City for the MCA Grand National, I call Larry to get the garage crew ready to come over on Aug 30th to put the transport on the engine and then we'll put it in the car. When I had the transmission rebuilt, the builder said to install a bronze pilot bushing in the rear of the engine for the 4 speed. It was ordered and waiting to be installed so I tapped in part way with my rubber hammer.







### OWNERSHIP NOT ESSENTIAL......ENTHUSIASM IS:

The 30th arrives, I move all the cars to the street, Kim and I move the Cobra II to the other side of the garage (have a split 2 car garage) and we also had to turn it around. You see, I push, and Kim blocks the tire with a 2x4 and turns the steering wheel. After much hollering on my part, we get it turned around but going into the garage it scrapped the front passenger wheel lip (more hollering).

The guys were coming between 5-5:30, so I set up the engine in the middle of the open bay, set out in line the flywheel, clutch plate and disc, bell housing, trany, starter and headers. As I'm waiting for them to arrive I keep looking at the pilot bushing and it looks small. I'm thinking, this is step #1 and if it doesn't work the guys will have supper and go home. Larry, Paul, Fred and Ron arrive and sure enough, it's wrong (found out they sent me one for a GM). While they eat, I'm on the phone: NAPA's closed, O'Reilly's can order one, but thank God, Car Quest has one, but they close in 20 minutes. Off Larry and I go to Car Quest (price \$4.30, the bronze one bought off line \$28.50).

Get back, bronze GM pilot bushing removed, new installed, engine shield and flex plate installed, clutch disc and plate installed, but wait...missing one metric bolt. Guy's take a break, I run to Ace. 10 minutes going through 12 metric bolt boxes, find one that might work, wait 5 minutes to check out (63 cents), run a block away to Rural King, find the right bolt and out of store in 3 minutes (20 cents).

I get back and the 20 cent Rural King bolt works just fine. Bell housing goes on, transmission goes in and while bolting it up we find the missing clutch plate bolt! We decide to fill the trany fluid up once it's in the car. Go to put the starter on as there is hardly any room once the engine is in the car and it hits the oil pan.

I've been reading for years now on Mustang II web sites that Mustang II oil pans are different, but did I remember this. No! I got a crate engine, it's just supposed to drop in and go, right? Luckily, I have a 78 Mustang 302 engine in the shed in the garage that I pulled from the first parts car for its 2 barrel intake, brackets, pulleys and reference. So we pull it out and sure enough, there's a big difference in oil pans. Guess what else was there--a 4 speed pilot bushing! We pulled the old oil pan, but it needed a serious cleaning inside and out, so the engine install will have to come on another day.

So the moral of this story is---if you think you're close to perfect and get everything planned out just right. Just get together with some friends and just show them how really human you are. They'll let you know about it for years to come!

As always, I hope to see you all at the next meeting. We'll have a report on the Kansas City MCA Grand National and upcoming cruise-ins the clubs been asked to participate in----Steve
