Where Have All the Ponies Gone--

In fact, I was on my way to look at a 69 Firebird when I bought my first Mustang back in the late winter of 1976.

Time to order parts for that winter update you want to do to your car or if needed, now is the best time to set up if you need time in a body/engine shop to beat the fall rush. 
