A couple of weeks ago I attended the Central Illinois car show in Springfield. I cruised up with Larry, Ron and Fred and was later joined by Kay and Jerry. The hardest part in teaching someone is that at a Regional show you judge one way but at a National show would never do (wires running thru the firewall to the battery because the owner installed an aftermarket stereo). An MCA National has set judging standards, Regional shows are what car owners feel is fine for them, so cleanliness and workmanship is what we really judge on. By the time we got to the forth car my judging partner was coming up with the same points that I was getting and by the time we were done he was very grateful and felt confident that he could volunteer to judge again. It gave me a good feeling that I could pass on something to someone else. But isn't that what life's all about? We've all had our mentors and those we've admired for one thing or another as we've grown and aged. We've married, had children and tried to install in them the values of a good life. Every day we learn and pass on things because someday we won't be there to carry on. On my tactical team at work, we teach every position because you never know when you'll be called upon to be the leader.

Within our club we have so many people with way more talents and knowledge than I can ever know, Larry, with his passion of Y blocks, flat heads, V-8's and everything Ford is beyond my ever being
