A note from Randy

Greetings fellow Mustang enthusiasts. For those of you who did not know, I retired in March after forty-one years of U.S. Government service. In August, I began working as a government contractor which will require me to travel extensively. Hopefully, my dear brother will be able to fill my shoes when I cannot be present. Please treat him with as much respect as can be expected for someone who traverses the countryside in a Prius.

Spending time away from home always makes me appreciate my Mustangs that much more. My love of Mustangs began in the mid 70's when I was able to obtain my driver's permit. My dad needed a car to travel back and forth to work from Okawville, IL to St. Louis. He offered me a proposition which seemed to benefit him a lot more than me but at least I owned a Mustang. The deal was for me to purchase a 1965 first generation 2-door hardtop with a 200 cubic inch six cylinder, 3 speed manual transmission for him to have available for work. My dad worked the 3<sup>rd</sup> shift which was from 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. having Tuesdays and Wednesdays off. Factoring in school days, this meant my car was not readily accessible to me. His days off were not favored by the girls to go out on dates in the Mustang or were there parties to attend. My father added further restrictions by not allowing me to drive the car to school on his days off as my family lived only a few blocks from the high school; he figured I could walk to school. What a proposition! I don't remember what I paid for the car, but I do know I rode my bike to the First National Bank of Okawville and applied for and obtained a car loan for the car of my dreams, a Rangoon Red beauty with a black interior. Unfortunately, my cousin wrecked and totaled this car about two years after I purchased it.

Shortly after losing my '65, my dad put me in touch with some former neighbors who lived in Fairview Heights. They owned a 1966 first generation sprint 200 limited edition 2-door hardtop with an automatic transmission. My understanding is that this car was part of the Millionth Mustang Success Sales Initiative. This Ford promotion was equipped with a dressed-up chrome air cleaner with a special decal and a chrome air-filler cap. Additional options that came with this car included a center console; painted side accent stripes (color matched with the car's interior); no chrome rear quarter ornaments; and a set of deluxe 48 spoke blue center wirestyle wheel covers. This low-milage, Silver Blue beauty was my first car which I entered in a car show (Okawville Wheat Festival). As luck would have it, this car met its demise when I wrecked and totaled it.

I hesitated buying a 3<sup>rd</sup> Mustang because I was afraid that a twist of fate involving the proverb "3<sup>rd</sup> time's a charm" might see my life shortened. I ended up throwing caution to the wind for when I returned from Afghanistan, I purchased my 1965 fastback which is now powered by a 331 stroker. Dorinda and I then purchased our 2012 Ford Mustang Club of America Special Edition coupe when my mom passed away; I figured it was time to experience

driving a Mustang year-round. Other family members have owned 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> generation Mustangs. I'd say our family is a Mustang family like yours.

The approach of the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Ford Mustang has made me a bit nostalgic (and feeling older since it was "born" only 2 years after myself) and proud to own a piece of the Mustang ancestry. It has evolved over the years and still sparks a conversation with the mention of its name. Recently on CBS Saturday Morning, a segment was aired show casing the Mustang's history, up to the current 2024 7<sup>th</sup> generation with its biggest engine ever. Not only is Mustang keeping pace with the crave for power by its enthusiasts, and it now has a workforce that is comprised of 30% women engineers with its lead engineer being female – a far cry from the 4% at its beginnings. The 2024 Mustang will have a new all-digital and customizable dashboard as well as a 500 horse power dark horse model; it will still hold on to its V8 engine. It is America's last gas-powered sports car and increasingly stands alone as it is the only passenger car Ford currently makes, while Dodge plans to electrify its Challenger and Chevrolet is discontinuing the Camaro. As with all iconic and good things, the Mustang is still standing the test of time. Ride, Sally, ride ~
