<u>A note from Randy</u>

Greetings fellow Mustang enthusiasts.

In October of 2002, I was nine-thousand, six-hundred and fifty-seven miles away from home working in Alice Springs, Australia. I saw some amazing things in the outback; pickled beets served on hamburgers, ants, kangaroos, road trains, right-hand drive cars, and yes, Mustangs.

First off, who serves pickled beets on hamburgers? Australians do, and they will give you a dirty look if you order one without it. They call it beetroot and that's how your McDonald's hamburger is served. I ate it but I wasn't impressed.

I was amazed to see so many ants. There are over 4000 known species of ants in Australia. Apparently, a majority of the ones I saw are not native to the country as they were introduced from elsewhere. So called pest ants were everywhere to include my room; I couldn't get away from them.

Kangaroos are all over in the outback. I read that 5% of all reported vehicle accidents involve striking animals and that kangaroos make up 90% of those animal collisions. Kangaroos, upon seeing headlights, hop towards the light which causes accidents. State Farm found that the odds of hitting a deer in Illinois is 1 in 148, so be careful of both deer and kangaroos when cruising in your Mustang in southern Illinois ③.

Semi-trailer trucks are common in the outback of Australia, but they are not called semis - they are called road trains. You would not believe how long these monstrosities are in length. A road train consists of a tractor unit and up to five semi-trailers. They are up to 197 feet long, weighing close to 441,000 pounds. By contrast, U.S. tractor trailers are 72 feet long and loaded weigh up to 80 thousand pounds. Road trains do not stop on a dime, and you better have a souped-up Mustang to get around them.

Right-hand drive cars are what's driven in Australia. The group of five I traveled with rented a Toyota Land Cruiser with the steering wheel on the right. Mail carriers in the U.S. may be accustomed to driving vehicles with the steering wheel on the right, but I can tell you none of us were. In fact, no one in our group felt comfortable driving this vehicle so I got stuck performing this duty. The most challenging aspect of driving was using my left hand to shift this standard transmission vehicle; I'm right-handed for heaven's sake.

Yes, there are Mustangs in Australia. I traveled to a dragstrip which I think is now called the Alice Springs Inland Dragway and was awestricken to see Mustangs being raced (see pictures below). What a sight to see in this part of the world! I remember talking to everyone at the track who would listen about my love of Mustangs, including those who owned a Toyota Prius like my brother. A review of the internet found 2,194 Mustangs being sold in Australia this year, giving it 53.2% of the market of sports cars that are under \$80,000.
