# **AUGUST 2024 MEETING MINUTES**

SIMA met at the Moose Lodge in Edwardsville on August 13th at 7:00p.m. President Randy Mueller called the meeting at 7:00pm. There were 27 members present. A motion was made by Paul B. and seconded by Larry R. to accept the July secretary's report. All approved. Larry R. gave the treasurer's report. An accounting was given of the items related to the July car show. A motion was made to accept the report by Ralph and seconded by Paul B. It was approved by all.

#### MCA report (Kim Strickell):

There are currently 14, 872 MCA members. This is down 264 members since April. The MCA 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary show will be August 28-30, 2026, in Braselton, GA. There are plans to go to Stone Mountain, GA, which is the site of the first MCA National Show in 1976. This will be at the Michelin Raceway Road Atlanta in Braselton and will be a national show as well as a track event.

Plans are to make the Ozark Raceway a yearly show. The next one will be May 23-25, 2025. They are working to make a list of hotels and Air B&Bs. The show will not be there in 2026 due to the MCA 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, but plans are to have it at the Ozark Raceway again in 2027, 2028, and 2029.

In conjunction with the MCA 50<sup>th</sup>, they are planning to raffle a 2026 Mustang. It will be white with red interior. Board members and national directors will not be eligible to purchase tickets. Winning the car comes with a 1-year MCA membership to avoid taxes. Details are still being worked out. You must be an MCA member to buy a ticket. The Mustang at the Crossroads was this past weekend. Eight club members attended. Derrick and Staci Bilzing took their '06 GT convertible and earned a gold award. He also got 1<sup>st</sup> place for his convertible model car he built. Randy and Dorinda Mueller, Dan and Theresa Mueller, as well as Steve and Kim Strickell, also attended and judged. Theresa trained with Steve on OD/DD 64-'04 cars and will get her certificate. Dan judged concours '65 & '66 on Friday and Saturday he judged OD/DD '65-'21 and received his certification. Randy, Dorinda, and Kim judged OD/DD '05-'21. Steve got to teach a session on how to judge a Concours Mustang II with Theresa, Randy, and Dan, plus other fellow judges.

Get a load out of this. I was reading an article from motortrend.com and read there may be a Shelby on the moon! "Is there a Shelby on the moon? It's possible. Shop foreman Bob Wyatt, in an interview in The Shelby American, is quoted as saying, "We worked on the moon buggy to the east of the production shop. That has never been made common knowledge. Security was tight."

Wyatt never learned if the buggy they worked on was the one that landed on the moon and is still up there today. Mission Control missed a good opportunity. They could have painted it with blue LeMans stripes and called it the ET350.
